

# THE BERMUDA JOB MARKET *Employment Briefs*



## Introduction

The 2019 edition of the Bermuda Job Market Employment Briefs is based on data collected from the 2018 Employment Survey. The Survey reference week was August 26 to September 1 2018. The annual Employment Survey is a census of all businesses on the island and the Employment Briefs is used to illustrate and highlight the main findings of the Survey. The purpose of the Employment Survey is to provide a broad count of all filled jobs in the Bermuda labour market by selected demographics, industrial and occupational groups. The information collected from the Survey is the primary source used for analyzing employment trends in Bermuda for government, commerce and the general public.

Users are cautioned against making direct comparisons with the Labour Force Survey and census results because the results are not comparable. The age of job holders is not limited to persons sixteen years and older as is the case for the working population in the Labour Force Survey and the census reports. In addition, the counts presented in this publication differ from the census working population since each job holder is counted according to the number of jobs they hold.

This edition examines the employment changes between the years 2017 and 2018. More detailed information on Bermuda's job market can be obtained from the 2018 Employment Survey Tabulation Set. ## 2018 Highlights

- Total filled jobs increased by less than half of one percent (+151) to 33,810.
- Total filled jobs by Other non-Bermudians rose by 3% (+223) to 7,563.
- Filled jobs within Transport & Communications declined by 4% (-85) to 1,889 jobs.
- Filled jobs within Hotels rose by 8% (+186) to 2,383 jobs.

- Filled jobs for Service Workers and Shop and Market Sales Workers (Service Workers) increased by 2% (+138) to 7,249.
- The median gross annual income for all job holders in establishments with ten or more filled jobs increased by 2% (+\$1,088) to \$65,338.

## Aggregate Employment

Table 1 and Chart 1 show that between 2017 and 2018 the number of total filled jobs grew. Aggregate employment, as measured by reporting employers, stood at 33,810 filled jobs in 2018 compared to 33,659 one year ago.

Changes were recorded in the sex, Bermudian status and racial composition of the job market. Males accounted for 95 more filled positions in 2018 while females held an additional 56 jobs. Other non-Bermudian employment increased by 223 filled jobs, from 7,340 to 7,563. The number of Bermudian job holders decreased by 92 filled jobs, while non-Bermudian Spouses of Bermudians and Permanent Resident Certificate holders gained a total of 11 and 9 more filled positions, respectively. The share of filled jobs held by persons of mixed and other racial heritages grew by 236 positions, while whites recorded a decrease of 80 filled positions.

## Largest Growth in Service Occupations

Three major occupational groups reported the largest employment gains in 2018. As presented in Table 1, job growth was highest in absolute terms for the Service Workers (+138), Professionals (+56) and Senior Officials and Managers (+51).

Within the Service Workers occupational group, growth in filled jobs was most prevalent among General Waiters (+77), Housekeepers (+53) and Security Officers (+47). Some occupations that increased within Professional occupations were Registered Nurses (+32), Actuaries (+19) and Certified Accountants (+18). In the Senior Officials and Managers occupational group, the job market increased in Directors and Chief Executives (+46), Finance Managers (+30) and Food and Beverage Sub-managers (+18).

In contrast, employment levels declined for the Clerical (-63)

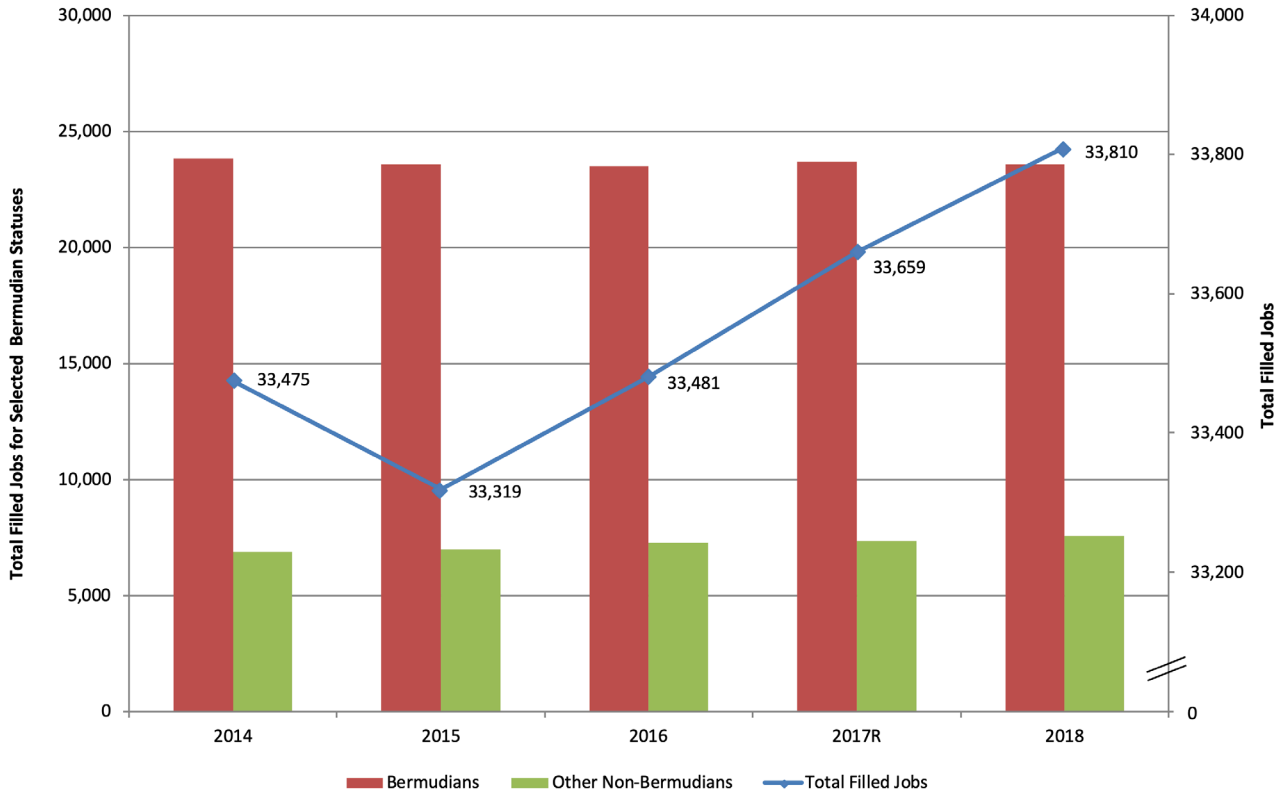

and Elementary (-54) occupational groups. Employment losses were reported in occupations such as Junior Clerks (-43), Finance Clerks (-27) and Janitors (-25).

### Largest Jobs Growth within Hotel and Construction Industries

According to Table 2, the Hotel industry grew by 186 filled jobs between 2017 and 2018 while the Construction industry edged up 128 positions. Further employment gains were reported in the Retail Trade & Repair Services and International Business sectors as both sectors rose by 45 filled jobs.

Employment levels in the Hotel industry grew in response to a demand for positions such as Chef de Parties (+57), Housekeepers (+56) and General Waiters (+31). Approximately three-quarters of employment growth in this sector was attributed to an increase in jobs filled by males (+142). According to the age of job holders, 25 to 39 year olds accounted for the majority of the increase between Survey years (+95 jobs). By Bermudian status, other non-Bermudians accounted for 115 more jobs than they did in 2017 while Bermudians

filled 47 more jobs. The distribution by race shows that persons of mixed and other races held the largest share of job growth with 99 filled jobs.

The Construction industry reported increases in occupations such as Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Plant Installers and Mechanics (+17), Masons (+13) and Plumbers (+12). Males filled 110 of the 128 additional jobs in 2018 while females accounted for 18 filled jobs. By age groups, workers who were 55 to 64 years old gained an additional 64 positions while those 25 to 39 gained 53 filled positions in the Construction industry. Other non-Bermudians filled 48 more jobs compared to 2017 while Bermudians filled 42 more positions. By race, persons of mixed and other races accounted for the largest share of the increase with 45 filled jobs.

In contrast, the Transport & Communications and Other Community, Social & Personal Services sectors posted the largest job losses in 2018.

Businesses that provide Transport & Communications services reported 85 fewer jobs in 2018 compared to 2017. Within this industry, employers recorded significant

reductions in the number of Airline Passenger Agents (-17) and Airline Freight Agents (-10). This sector had 67 fewer males in filled jobs during the 2018 reference week compared to 2017. Bermudians in this sector lost 73 jobs in 2018. Job losses were also registered for blacks at 66 fewer jobs in 2018 compared to the previous year.

Fostered by a reduction in Beauticians (-22), Bartenders (-9), Janitors (-9), Pastors (-8), and Social Workers (-7), the Other Community, Social & Personal Services sector shrank by 56 jobs in 2018. Among job holders aged 54 to 64 years, the number of jobs slipped by 18 jobs while there were 18 fewer job holders aged 40 to 54 years. Females accounted for the greater share of the job declines at 33 while whites held 32 fewer positions. In regards to Bermudian status, the number of jobs filled by Bermudians in this sector slid by 35.

### Employment Income Rises

Employment income includes all forms of monetary compensation received by employees and self-employed persons before voluntary and mandatory payroll deductions. Median gross annual income is the level of annual income that half of all job holders earn more than and the other half earn less than.

Table 3 presents the median gross annual income for establishments with ten or more filled jobs by sex, age, Bermudian status and race. The table also outlines

median gross annual income (median income) by the major divisions of economic activity and the major occupational groups.

The 2018 median income earned by all job holders was \$65,338. This amount represented a 2% increase in annual pay compared to the 2017 figure of \$64,250. In comparison to the moderate rise in median earnings, the annual inflation rate in August 2018 was 0.9%.

The profile of median income by race shows that white job holders earned \$90,416 in 2018. On average, black job holders earned \$59,006 while job holders of mixed & other races earned \$54,979 per year. The pay disparity between the two major racial groups exceeded \$31,000 in 2018. This gap was caused by disproportionate shares of white workers and black workers in higher paying roles such as Senior Officials and Managers and in Professional occupations together with uneven shares of blacks and whites in lower paying jobs such as Service Workers, Skilled Agricultural and Fisheries Workers and workers in Elementary Occupations (Tables 3 and 4).

Table 5 presents the twenty lowest paying occupations held by Bermudian job holders who worked normally 35 hours or more per week and earned less than the median income. Among Bermudian job holders who received the least earnings those who worked as Bus Person/Commis Waiters or Lifeguards earned \$21,000 per year. The median pay for Bermudian Chambermaids, Housekeepers, and Waiters was \$26,029, \$28,954 and \$30,214, respectively.

Table 6 presents the twenty lowest paying occupations held by non-Bermudian job holders who worked normally 35 hours or more per week and earned less than the median income. Non-Bermudians include non-Bermudian Spouses of Bermudians, Permanent Resident Certificate holders and Other non-Bermudians. According to Table 6, the median gross annual income for the lowest paid non-Bermudian job holders shows that on average Lifeguards earned \$21,000, Chambermaids received \$24,273 and Housekeepers were paid \$33,000 in return for their services. The median pay for non-Bermudians who worked as Bar Stewards and Assistant Cooks was \$33,750 and \$35,040, respectively.
